

## Crafts and Practical Skills

A range of fully guided natural, practical craft sessions are offered.

Typically held at client's premises, outdoor craft sessions can be tailored to specific needs. They can take the form of single "taster" days, in blocks of six weekly events or as regular activity sessions throughout the year.

Crafts taught are

- Dry and living willow weaving
- Outdoor art creations
- Whittling
- Rustic furniture
- Straw bale and cob structures
- Bird and bat boxes and feeders
- Wildlife habitats

Group sizes range from 3 – 6 students depending on student capabilities and last around 2 hours.

All materials and equipment are supplied.



## Food and Farming

Learn about farming with a full day of events at a local farm.

Experience growing food and animal husbandry in a safe environment. Help the farmer plant and harvest their crops. Learn about livestock and their needs in a farming environment.

Activities include,

- Feeding animals
- Planting and maintaining vegetables and fruit
- Fencing
- Estate and Woodland Management
- Coppicing

Group sizes range from 6-12 students depending on student capabilities. Minibus transfer to the farm and lunch included.



## Bush Crafts

Learn bush crafts on a full day trip to a local woodland site.

Learn how to utilise and read nature. Learn self sufficiency and transferable practical skills.

Activities include,

- Wildlife ID and tracking
- Survival techniques
- Shelter building
- Wild Food
- Water sourcing
- Safe camp techniques
- Knots
- Safe tool use
- Signalling and identifying direction
- Useful natural materials

Group sizes range from 6-8 students depending on student capabilities. Minibus transfer and lunch included.

## Conservation and Countryside

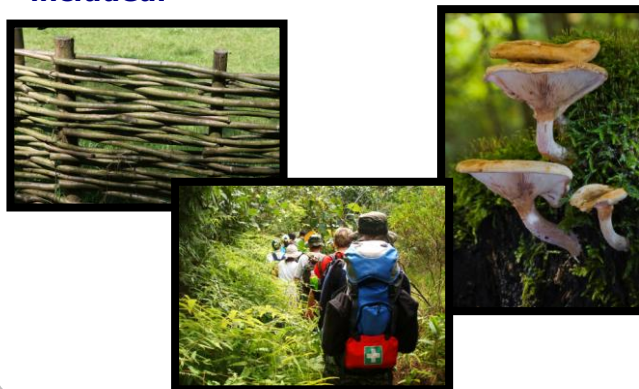
Experience a full day of events at a local Park or Woodland.
